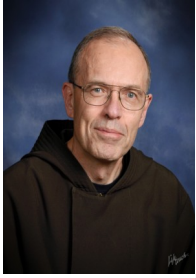

The Intercession of the Saints

“Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness ... They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and men, Christ Jesus So by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped.” Catechism of the Catholic Church #956

This week we celebrate our communion with **St. Patrick** (March 17) and **St. Joseph** (March 19). **St. Patrick** (389-461) most likely was born in Great Britain. As a young man he was captured and sold as a slave in Ireland where he had to tend sheep. Having escaped from slavery, he chose to enter the priesthood, and later, as bishop, he tirelessly preached the Gospel to the people of Ireland where he converted many to the Catholic faith and established the Church.

Christ behind me, Christ before me,

Christ to comfort and restore me,
Christ beneath me, Christ above me,
Christ in quiet, Christ in danger,
Christ in hearts of all that love me,

St. Joseph was chosen by God, the Father, to be the Guardian of the Redeemer, Jesus, and Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was chosen to be the head of the Holy Family. He took loving care of Mary and gladly dedicated himself to Jesus’ upbringing and he continues his care for the Church which is the Family of God. St. Joseph is the Patron of the Universal Church.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

During the next few weeks I will be sharing recipes for the Lenten Season, in observance of Abstinence (not eating meat) on Fridays. By denying ourselves, we try to make an "empty space" in our lives for the Lord to fill up. I hope you enjoy these Lenten recipes.

MEATLESS EGGPLANT PARMESAN:

Ingredients:

- 1 large firm eggplant
- 2 eggs beaten
- 1 1/2 cups Panko bread crumbs
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 8 oz. package sliced mozzarella cheese
- 2 Tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 large jar of herb tomato sauce (freeze any left over sauce and label)

DIRECTIONS:

Peel eggplant and slice into 1/4 inch slices. Dip slices into egg and then coat well with the bread crumbs. Saute eggplant in medium high vegetable oil about 3 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Add more oil if needed. Place half of the eggplant in a lightly greased 2 quart glass baking dish. Top with half of the mozzarella cheese and cover lightly with the herb tomato sauce. Repeat and then top with Parmesan cheese over the top.

Bake uncovered in preheated 375 degree oven for 20 minutes or until cheese melts and sauce is bubbly. Serve with a salad and Italian bread.
