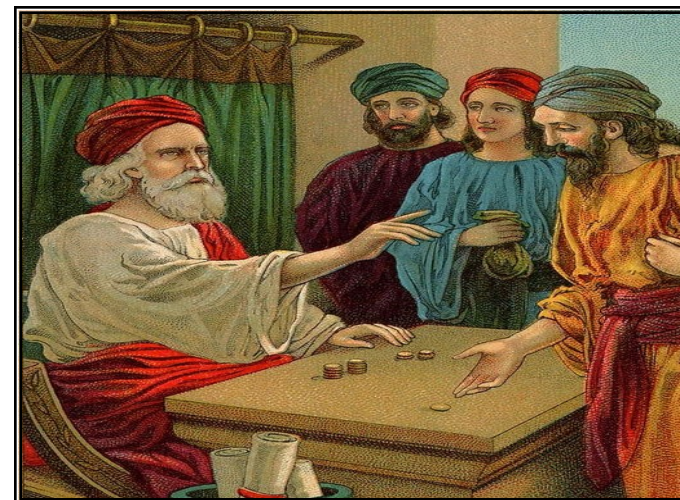

The Anointing of the Sick

“Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.” (James 5:14-15)

The sacrament of the **Anointing of the Sick** will be administered after the homily at **St. Anthony’s** next Saturday (November 22) at the 5:30 PM Mass and on Sunday (November 23) at the 10:30 AM Mass. The Anointing of the Sick will also be administered at **Our Lady of the Hills** next Sunday (November 23) at the 8:30 AM Mass. Who may receive the Anointing of the Sick? Any elderly person, or any, person – no matter what age – with a serious illness or a debilitating condition.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church the effects of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick are:

- **The uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church;**
- **The strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the suffering of illness or old age;**
- **The forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance;**
- **The restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;**
- **The preparation for passing over to eternal life.**
