FISH ON FRIDAY?

Every Friday of Lent is a day of abstinence, which means that Catholics 14 and older are bound to abstain from meat. Invalids, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt. The law of abstinence forbids the use of meat, but permits eggs, milk products and condiments made of animal fat (and, of course, fish). In a society where gratifying every desire is considered the surest road to happiness, exercising a little extra self-control is especially admirable.

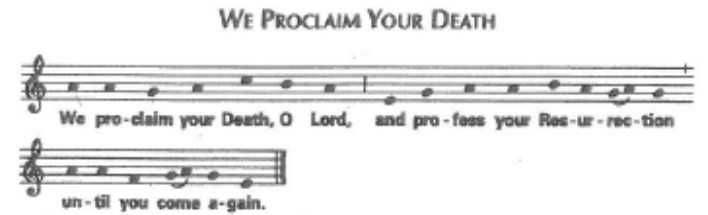
