Pontifical Good Friday Collection: April 15—This annual collection not only supports the Holy Places, but above all provides for those pastoral, charitable, educational and social works which the Church supports in the Holy Land for the welfare of the Christian brethren and of the local communities. “Moreover, for two consecutive years, the Christians of the Holy Land have celebrated Easter and Christmas in a sort of isolation, without the warmth and solidarity of pilgrims visiting the Holy Places and local communities. Families have suffered beyond measure, more from the lack of work than from the immediate effects of the pandemic itself. It is by the express wish of the Popes that the collection “*Pro Terra Sancta*” was begun and continues to be taken up on the day of the saving Passion of our Lord, Good Friday. It is not something ancient or outdated, because it expresses above all our awareness of being rooted in the proclamation of redemption, which spread from Jerusalem and reached us all. The gesture of offering, even a small one, but by everyone, like the widow’s mite, allows our brothers and sisters to continue to live, to hope and to offer a living witness to the Word made flesh in places and on the streets that saw his presence.” **Please be generous.**

University of Dayton’s VLCFF—Would you like to delve more deeply into your faith? Look more closely at what Catholics believe? Then this course may interest you!!

Survey of Catholic Doctrine Apr 25-May 15 (registration opens Mar 9)

This course will look at some of the major doctrines of the Catholic Church. Participants will come to a better understanding of the Trinity, original sin, church, salvation history, and the communion of saints. We will look at the meaning of magisterium, ecumenism, eschatology, and other Catholic terms.

By the end of the course we will have:

- Understood some arguments for the existence of God.
- Defined revelation as God's communication with us
- Articulated why the Trinity is the central mystery of our Christian faith and life.
- Articulated how Scripture speaks of God as creator
- Described original sin as a condition we are born into where we are inclined toward choosing evil
- Understood Jesus as God’s self-revealed
- Understood the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church
- Understood the role of the Church in God’s plan of salvation and the relationship of the Catholic Church and other religions
- Articulated how Mary and the saints are models of Christian holiness
- Described the Church’s teachings in the area of eschatology

This course will be facilitated by Dr. Rodica Stoicoiu, it is offered through the VLCFF program of the University of Dayton and underwritten by the Diocese, which will cover the tuition and the book. To register please contact Jeanne McKeets at jmckeets@dwc.org.
