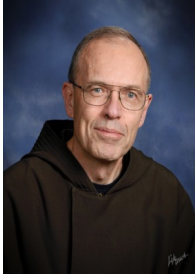

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

This cake recipe is great to serve at a Graduation Party, Memorial Day cookout or any time family and friends gather together. With today being Mother's Day, I can't think of a mother or friend that meant more to her children and church family than Bernice Endres. Bernice shared this recipe with me many years ago, and it's still one of my favorites.

Turtle Cake

- 1 German Chocolate cake mix
- 1-1/2 cups water
- 3 eggs
- 1-1/2 sticks unsalted butter, melted
- 14 oz. pkg. caramels
- 1/3 cup - plus 2 Tbsp. evaporated milk
- 12 oz. pkg. semi-sweet choc. chips
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Directions:

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine cake mix, water, eggs, and melted butter. Blend until smooth.

Pour 1/2 of the batter (about 2 cups) into a greased and floured 9" x 13" glass baking dish. Bake for 15 minutes.

In a double boiler, melt the caramels and evaporated milk.

As soon as the cake comes out of the oven, pour mixture over the cake.

Note: Do not spread all the way to the edge. Sprinkle choc. chips and pecans over the caramel.

Pour remaining cake batter over the top and return to the oven. Continue baking at 350 for another 30 minutes.

Dust top of cake with powdered sugar or spread with a milk chocolate frosting.
