The Holy Spirit and the Life of Grace: God's Divine Life Within Us** **8. Why Do I Need the Church?: The Mystery of Jesus' Death and Resurrection** **9. Mary and the Saints: Our Spiritual Mother and the Communion of Saints** **10. The Last Things: What Happens After We Die?**

Part 1 of the series will begin in the Parish Center at St. Anthony after the 6:30 pm Mass on Wednesday, September 17, and continue on the Wednesday evenings up to and including, November 19.
