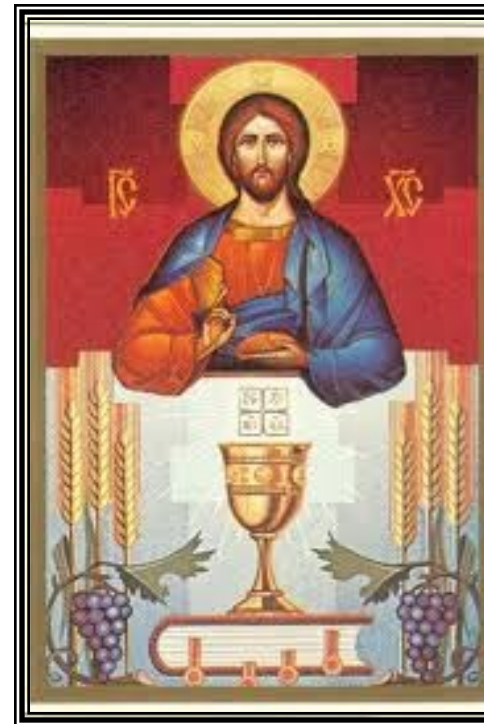

### Corpus Christi

Today we celebrate the Feast of **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)**. It is a feast on which we give thanks to God for the gift of the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus said: *“I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; ... he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life ... abides in me, and I in him.”* –John 6:51,54,56

St. John Vianney (1786-1859), the patron saint of priests said this about the Holy Eucharist: *“God would have given us something greater if he had had something greater than himself.”* Yes the Holy Eucharist is Jesus, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. It is God’s gift of Himself to us. The Holy Eucharist shows us how much God loves us.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: *“Communion with the Body and Blood of Christ increases the communicant’s union with the Lord, forgives his venial sins, and preserves him from grave sins. Since receiving this sacrament strengthens the bonds of charity between the communicant and Christ, it also reinforces the unity of the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ.”*

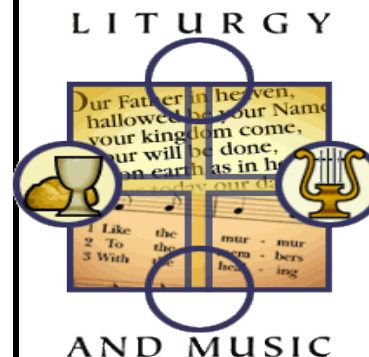

### LORIE’S MUSIC NOTES

In John’s gospel today, he uses the term “flesh” for both the Eucharist and the Incarnation. The Bread of Life that makes us live is nothing other than Christ himself: the Word-made-flesh. If the bread promised by Jesus will give life forever, it is because the Son of Man is given by the Father and descends from heaven to give us that very same life. Our songs today reflect this theme of life-giving bread.

### MINUTE MEDITATION

June 24 — Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist

Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: “I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John...” But John would have agreed completely with what Jesus added: “Yet the least in the kingdom of God is greater than he” (Luke 7:28). His purpose was to prepare the way for Jesus. His Baptism, he said, was for repentance. But One would come who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. John is not worthy even to carry his sandals. His attitude toward Jesus was: “He must increase; I must decrease” (John 3:30).
