

Mass Intention requests are scheduled in the order they are received.





The 2024 Catholic Sharing Appeal Update—As of **April 11, 2024**, St. Anthony has raised **\$6,870**, which is **69%** of our parish goal of \$9,915. Our Lady of the Hills has raised **\$4,700**, which is **81%** of our parish goal of \$5,800. St. Elisabeth Convent Religious Articles for Purchase—We are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent (Belarus). **The exposition will take place after Mass this weekend.**

The Sisterhood of St. Elisabeth was founded in 1996. Our missionary work began in the National mental hospital located not far from the Convent. Our Sisters take care of mentally challenged children and adults. The life of children with diagnoses, such as Down syndrome, birth traumas or congenital physical defects, may be quite short and it is painful to see them suffering. Also, the adult patients need constant support owing to the fact that their illnesses make it impossible for them to adapt socially.

In recent years, a shelter and house of Labor for former drug and alcohol addicted people was organized 20 miles away from the Convent. A lot of homeless, struggling, and lost people get a chance for new start in life to find God. In order to help these people, some workshops were organized on the premises of the Convent where vulnerable people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God—working together with nuns and sisters to make icons (including hand-painted), crosses, crucifixes, wood carvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, rosaries and vestments. All these goods are made with love and prayer to bring blessings to their owners. We are happy and thanking God for the opportunity to introduce our mission and offer these items for purchase to you.

St. Anthony Quarterly Financial Report: The St. Anthony Finance Council wants to continue to update you each quarter on the financials of our Parish. Through March 31st, our total income this year is up 3% over last year, and they are almost 7% higher than what we budgeted for in 2024. Also, our operating expenses this year, excluding any maintenance & repairs which are paid for from the Gould Endowment, through March 31st are 3% lower than 2023, but 1% higher than what we budget this year. Thanks to your generosity, we are able to continue to maintain a financially healthy Parish. Special Disaster Relief Collection: April 20 & 21, 2021

Efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. West Virginia encountered tornados, microbursts, strong winds, heavy rains, and mudslides. Several counties have experienced moderate-to-substantial flooding, notably along the Ohio River and its tributaries. The National Weather Service has confirmed 5 tornados in West Virginia – Huntington (Cabell/Wayne), St. Albans (Kanawha), Cross Lanes (Kanawha), Quick (Kanawha) and Lavista (Fayette). A State of Emergency has been declared in 17 West Virginia Counties.

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of April 20-21, 2024, in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. **Checks should be made out to your respective parish with “Disaster Relief” on the memo line.** Donations can also be made on the diocesan website at <https://dwc.org/disaster-relief/>.

Proceeds from this collection will support the long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities West Virginia. Their offices assist families long after other organizations have moved out. The role of Catholic Charities will last months and years as they help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions. All of the money raised will stay in West Virginia to assist our neighbors.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.
